Vandalism is not something volunteers can do anything about, we can shake our heads and wonder why, but ultimately it is the community Volunteers time and community money that the Vandals is stealing from everyone who lives in spring Valley. I guess some people feel that need to destroy or to hurt others to feel better about themselves. That's not how I was raised.

Long grass is what many predators use to hunt their prey. There is a very small predator that climbs to the top of the long grass and waits with its claws held wide out to grab hold of their victim as they walk through the area. Ticks are present and can cause Lyme Disease if bitten and a red rash appears at the bite site, go to the doctor! Lyme Disease can be treated easily right off but if left un-treated can be quite debilitating as we age.

Snakes should be coming out soon. King, Gopher, Water snakes and of course the Western Diamondback also known as the Pacific Western Rattlesnake.

Please talk to your kids to leave the snakes alone. A few years ago, a child caught a small Rattlesnake and was showing it off, he got bit in the face and died. So be sure to talk to them and tell them to leave all snakes be.

Wildlife gives birth at this time of year, please keep your dogs under control and be careful driving. No one wants to hurt Baby Wildlife.

WOLF CREEK FIREWISE by Win Cary

I have been contacted that there is a plan to have a wood chipping crew come to Spring Valley. If you would like to take advantage of this program, call Win Cary at 707-998-3004 to get on the list. Your tree

and brush waste will need to be stacked next to the road, cut ends facing the street so the fire crew can easily pick up each limb and put it into the chipper. Wolf Creek volunteers are willing to help you get ready for the chipping crew. Look for more information in future newsletters and the "Wolf Creek Firewise Community" Facebook.

If you have an Air Quality Control burn permit, the final day to allow legal burning is April 30. I thought the permits were good until May 31, but I was mistaken.

The Firewise volunteers are looking forward to seeing you at the **Neighbor Fest Block Party** at the Community Center on Saturday, May 6, from 10 am to 2 pm. Lunch will be available, activities for children, and lots of information to help you keep your home and community safe from wild fires. We will have a number of public agencies and local businesses attending and providing information for our residents.

CAMPGROUNDS by Helen Mitcham

Lots of work continues on clearing downed tree limbs – seems like there's another one each day! Joe is looking into chipping the leftovers especially since the burn season ends April 30th and we also took the step of spraying for weed control in areas that get the most use. I've had comments – positive ones – about the placement of tables and benches along the creek. When one of the tables at a campsite is replaced, we relocate it to areas we think you'll enjoy. This is an especially beautiful time of year in the campground area – everything's getting ready to bud out and soon all the wildflowers will be brightening up the paths.

In the next day or two, you'll receive the annual Campground letter detailing expenditures from April 1 last year through March 31, 2023 and plans for the upcoming fiscal year. The new budget was submitted and includes repair to the back wall of the Center and painting the entire building. It's been 20+ years and we need it. We will continue to work on the lighting and electrical system at the Center as well.

Please remember to **close and lock the gate** when you enter or leave. This simple step works to keep vandalism to a minimum. If you need a key or want to make a reservation to stay overnight, please call me at 707-998-9194.

CSA #2 ADVISORY BOARD by Cindy Storrs

The following are updates to our seven goal items from our meeting on April 5, 2023:

- 1. Complete Quail Trail Water Project with thanks to the BOS and the contracted company. Continue to wait for the weather to warm up for paving. Asphalt plant may not be open yet.
 - 2. Complete bridge projects. No word about bridge projects from DPW.
- 3. Continue to work with Special Districts to renew or re-establish the Army Corps of Engineers (ACOE) permit for the Lake Recovery Project. Special Districts will bring a special presentation to the CSA May 3 meeting. Helen will talk with Scott about any new paperwork to update the "wall". Cindy will make some posters and quarter paper handouts for the breakfast informing people about the May 3 meeting at 7PM. Helen will put news out on FB and in the newsletter.
- 4. Establish a meaningful plan for road improvement that will include Hot Asphalt Equipment, potholes and road edges. Need Special Districts to purchase the hot asphalt and crack fill machines and the materials. (RY10Pro) Will focus on edge repair, potholes, crack sealing. Purchasing the machine and reviewing the priorities will be presented at the 4/6 meeting with Special Districts,
- 5. Support the Northshore Fire Protection District (NFPD) with completion of Station 77. **Plumbing for the kitchen is in. Rumor that the cement will be poured soon.**
- 6. Support the NFPD in having an Engine assigned to the Valley before fire season. Chief Mike plans to put engines in the building ASAP, even if it is not yet ready for overnight staffing.

7. Continue to work with Special Districts to produce quality finance reports. **Budget from** Special Districts is better organized this year. The Finance Committee will meet with Special Districts tomorrow (4/6) to review the budget and our priorities. The "water paying for water" (in order to preserve as much of our tax money for roads as possible) goal seems to have encountered a significant deficit this year. The Finance Committee will discuss this with Special Districts staff tomorrow and ask them to look into the matter. CSA will continue to work with Special Districts as this process unfolds.
